The University Of New England College Of Osteopathic Medicine (UNECOM) was established in 1978. Its mission is to transform students into health care leaders who advance patient-centered, high quality osteopathic primary care, research, and community health for the people of Maine, New England and the nation. UNE employees 35 full-time faculty and 26 part-time faculty, and has an enrollment of 175 students. UNE does accept foreign students, but does not have a special program for foreign students. The first 2 years of medical school students attend classes on campus, and in years 3 and 4 the students complete clinical rotations throughout the United States. UNE's objective is to become a recognized leader in educating primary care physicians for Maine, New England and the nation.

UNECOM has been recognized by U.S. News & World Report in its 2014 rankings for its national leadership in primary care training, geriatrics, rural medicine and family medicine.
