



Victoria University – Osteopathic Unit, School of Biomedical & Health Science

Victoria University was established in 1992 (the first year of the osteopathic program was 1994). The mission statement of the Osteopathic Unit is:

“The Osteopathy Unit offers quality educational programmes that emphasise evidence-informed practice and produce skilled, knowledgeable and reflective practitioners.”

Within the osteopathic unit itself, there are seven full-time academic staff, and ten part-time academic staff. Additionally, there are approximately 25 other sessional (casual) staff members who assist with the teaching of classes or supervise the on-campus clinics.

The university has approximately 250 full-time students in Victoria, but graduates are eligible to practice in all states and territories; there are no other locations in other countries.

Victoria University’s major activities is higher education and its objective is to teach students to become osteopaths. See previous mission statement of the Osteopathic Unit. International students are accepted if they meet its prerequisite entry requirements.
